DELIVERING ON VITAL FUNDING

THE Federal Government continues to provide funding for communities to build important projects in local regions.

The Liberal and Nationals' Government is delivering – from multimillion-dollar projects such as the \$8.1 million upgrade to the Cunningar rail terminal with new storage silos and loading chutes, in which the Government contributed \$2.5 million through its National Stronger Regions Fund, to smaller but no less significant funding such as the thousands of dollars delivered to organisations across the region, including Men's Sheds and RSL sub-branches.

And, of course, there is the \$9.3 billion the Government is contributing to Inland Rail project which will transform communities throughout the Riverina and Central West.

THE Liberal and Nationals' Government has delivered 867 base stations across Australia, including 20 in the Riverina and Central West.

A fourth round of funding for the Federal Government's mobile phone black spot program worth \$25 million will deliver improved coverage to regional and remote communities

The new round will call for applications from mobile phone carriers within the coming months and I urge and encourage residents and businesses throughout the Riverina and Central West to work with their councils, community organisations, emergency services and telcos to identify the black spots they want fixed.

This new round is an important step in our determination to deliver 21st Century telecommunications to rural and regional

We deserve it as much as people living in the cities.

The competitive selection process for round four of the program is expected to start in the second half of 2018.

The Regional Telecommunications Review has begun and the committee has been asked to hand down its recommendation before the end of the year.

GIVING STUDENTS WHAT THEY NEED TO SUCCEED

SCHOOLS in Wagga Wagga, Cootamundra and Temora have received grants totaling nearly \$2 million to help build vital learning facilities and staff amenities.

The grants to four non-government schools are being made available under the Federal Government's Capital Grants Program.

St Anne's Central School at Temora will receive \$624,454 towards the cost of refurbishing general learning areas in Block A.

Sacred Heart Primary School in Wagga Wagga will receive \$478,899 towards the cost of demolishing administration and staff facilities and construction of new facilities.

Wagga Wagga Christian College will receive \$450,000 towards building four primary

general learning areas, a staff room and staff amenities.

The Elouera Special School at Cootamundra will receive \$300,000 towards building a new multipurpose hall and re-purpose an existing building to provide an additional learning area.

Education is a building block for life and the Liberal and Nationals' Government is investing in providing the best education possible by helping schools get the facilities they deserve.

We are delivering lasting infrastructure for our young people to reach their potential.

The Capital Grants Program helps nongovernment schools improve their facilities where they otherwise may not have access to sufficient capital resources.

The Government is proving its commitment to regional Australia with the delivery of a needs-based funding model, recommended by David Gonski, as well as a \$53.9 million injection for Youth Allowance to allow more regional students to qualify.

HEALTH CARE A PRIORITY

RURAL and regional Australia is in healthier shape thanks to a number of Liberal and Nationals' initiatives.

While the announcement of the Murray-Darling Medical Schools network in last month's Budget was significant, the \$781,500 in funding going towards the Murrumbidgee Suicide Prevention Program is just as vital.

The Way Back – developed by *beyondblue* provides a trained support co-ordinator who will contact a person within 24 hours of being discharged from hospital after a suicide attempt.

The Government has provided more than \$19 million to the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network specifically for mental health and suicide prevention.

The Government has also provided more than \$1.8 million through the Rural Junior Doctor Training Innovation Fund towards on-the-job training in medical centres across the Riverina and Central West.

More than \$1 million has been granted to two Riverina disability service providers to deliver programs which make Australia more inclusive for people with a disability.

Ensuring safer communities

PERSONAL safety in West Wyalong and Parkes is to be improved thanks to the Safer Communities Fund.

The program aims to enhance community safety by providing funds for local security infrastructure such as closed-circuit television (CCTV), lighting and bollards.

I am pleased to have secured funding for Parkes Shire Council (\$226,306) towards upgrading its existing CBD security network and also to Bland Shire Council (\$39,450) towards CCTV on West Wyalong's Main Street.

Another \$30 million has been committed over 2018-19 and 2019-20 to improve the safety of our local communities.
